September 30, 2021, HAGÅÑTA, GUAM - Humanities Guåhan is pleased to announce our 30th anniversary! Officially incorporated in 1991, Humanities Guåhan, also known as Guam Humanities Council, is an independent non-profit organization and affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities, an independent federal agency.

Our organization is dedicated to fostering community engagement and dialogue, inspiring critical thinking, celebrating diversity and enriching the quality of life for island residents through the power of the humanities. Through public humanities programs we connect the ideas and traditions of the Guåhan community with the methods of scholars and academics, from interpretive exhibitions, family literacy, community grants and literary tours to cultural workshops and performances, food democracy tours, community conversations, and digital projects and publications. These programs help us to rethink our perspectives, ask questions about our diverse histories and cultures, and better understand one another in our daily lives.

As Humanities Guåhan reflects on our 30-year journey in sustaining the humanities on our island, we want to thank the numerous local, regional and national institutions, organizations and agencies that have provided the grant support necessary to carry out our work. We are also continually grateful to the diverse group of partners, artists, scholars and authors who have over the years made our work fulfilling, meaningful and a labor of love.

Our organization has also been nurtured by our cohort of former and current Board of Directors, Executive Director Kimberlee Kihleng, and our dedicated staff members through the years, including the late John AB Pangelinan who served as the Fiscal Officer extraordinaire for 16 years before his untimely passing in 2020.
